

PREPARING FOR ELECTIONS



Elections in Africa remain one of the most unpredictable and challenging times for businesses operating on the continent. Timely decision-making with the correct information and support is critical. Here is how International SOS can help you prepare for any elections.

CAUSES AND TRIGGERS

BEFORE THE POLLS

- PROTESTS due to perceived practicality of electoral laws, rallies, and term politics etc.
- COMMENTS OR SPEECHES by politicians that incite violence along religious or ethnic lines
- ARRESTS OR INCIDENTS targeting members of the opposition parties or media
- ATTEMPTS TO AMEND the Constitution by the ruling party/ incumbent president
- ATTACKS on election rallies or politically-motivated violence targeting opposition politicians

POSTPONEMENT OF ELECTIONS

- INTIMIDATION or widespread ELECTORAL IRREGULARITIES are reported at the polls
- In Presidential elections, VIOLENCE is generally more likely to occur during the second round or after election results
- COMMUNICATION SHUTDOWNS, which could be perceived as an attempt to curb the organisation of protests.
- LOGISTICAL ISSUES that might limits access of voting material to polling stations

AFTER THE POLLS

- Candidates PROCLAIM THEMSELVES VICTORS before announcement of the official results
- Party/ies CHALLENGE OFFICIAL RESULTS
- ARREST of opposition leaders/ targeting of political HQs
- DELAYS IN DECLARING official results due to logistics

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ELECTION PREPAREDNESS



Build organisational and employee resilience.

- Know the risks
- Identify sources of accurate and reliable information
- Conduct site, accommodation and itinerary-specific assessments
- Develop journey management plans
- Establish, train and test your crisis management team
- Review and revise policies and procedures
- Identify escalatory triggers
- Train your workforce on preparedness and response



Monitor the situation.

- Maintain situational awareness
- Verify information
- Consult local contacts
- Monitor triggers



Activate escalation management and evacuation protocols.

- Activate crisis management team
- Execute crisis management plans
- Evacuate, relocate or institute 'stand fast' plans
- Account for personnel
- Communicate updates
- Seek assistance

Organisations should adopt strategies to mitigate the risks for their mobile workforce ahead, during and following the elections.

- Are election-related scenarios included in your emergency preparedness plans?
